I meant to say also that the fence along the path by the allotment is falling down, in fact is completely out of the ground in places and pushing against our inner fence. It's just as bad along the edge of the orchard. The path is used continually by students from Warden Park and you cannot stop children larking and falling about which is why the fence gets damaged.

The council really should consider putting in a more substantial fence than chestnut fencing, it will be cost saving in the long run. The fence along the edge of the Play meadow is disintegrating but it has been there to my knowledge for over 20 years.
