Thank you to all those halls who have agreed to open their doors for this feature.

Ideas for Events

1.'Celebrating our Hall' - Open Weekend: 26th & 27th January 2019

What better time to showcase your hall and its facilities! Why not open up the hall up on the weekend of the 26th and 27th Jan to the community? You could create a fair-style event whereby your hall users could have a stall and advertise the activities they run.



This is an opportunity to raise the profile of your hall, praise your volunteers, celebrate its successes and maybe recruit new volunteers.



2. 'Thank You' Celebration

Host an Afternoon Tea or Cheese & Wine evening to celebrate the amazing work your volunteers do and say thank you with a certificate of appreciation. Alternatively, use an existing event as a platform to say 'Thank You'.

3. Geocaching – The Village Hall Series

The World's largest treasure hunting game is an ideal family outdoor activity, and with the Village Hall Series taking place, why not get involved? More details can be found here

4. Community Gardening

Do you have a community garden or flowers beds around your Village Hall? Encourage your community to help transform their public spaces by hosting a communal planting session. Whether planting seeds or 'in the green', this event can be aimed at all ages to bring the community together and inspire them to learn about plants.

(For non-green fingered readers, 'in the green' means planting bulbs when they are still in leaf, rather than a dried bulb).

Ideal bulbs include (depending on availability):

Snowdrops

Lily of the Valley

Wild Garlic

Winter Aconites

Wood Anemone

5. Good Neighbours Scheme

With Good Neighbours Schemes happening across East Sussex, this would be the perfect time to launch one in your area.

Good Neighbour Schemes are:

- Local voluntary run groups that offer a service in their community for those in need of help and support
- Services offered are determined by each local Good Neighbour Scheme and the needs of their local community
- Support is given to a wide range of people including older people, those temporarily in need through illness or recovery, people new to the area, or anyone who may be isolated or lonely in the community



The benefits of a Good Neighbour Scheme:



- Good Neighbour Schemes provide a 'safety net' in their community
- Support independent living, reduce isolation and loneliness
- Can prevent or delay the need for specialist or long term care
- They enhance and grow existing neighbourly networks
- They can complement statutory services

6. Host a Repair Cafe

A Repair Cafe is where people repair household electrical and mechanical devices, computers, bicycles, clothing, etc. They are organised by and for local residents. Repair Cafes are held at a fixed location where tools are available and where they can fix their broken goods with the help of volunteers. The objectives are to reduce waste, to maintain repair skills and to strengthen social cohesion.

- Invite your user groups and other interested organisations to attend and provide tables for the groups to have a display or provide leaflets. These events are a great opportunity for signing up new members and making others aware of what is going on at the hall every week
- Advertise the event as widely as possible in your community and on social media. Use any
 local What's On guides, including those in local media and Community websites, including
 Freecycle. Please send us an email with the details so we can promote your event on social
 media and on our website
- Invite your local Parish, District and County Councillors to attend
- Invite the local press along or take photos of your event and send them to the local press as this will continue to raise the profile of your hall and everyone who supports it


