Sam,

As far as I can tell, the fixing bolts that the bin was attached to are still in the ground (see pics); these are the concrete fixing bolts (Option A on the list).

I would be inclined to re-install it on the same basis in which case there would be no additional cost (the bin that was damaged and removed may well have been weakened through age). All other options would be expensive: the Ground-Lock system (Option E) would work but that's a further £71 and any other option (C or D) would require new cement work. The ballast options (F and G) would work but I doubt they would stop the vandals from removing the things again..
